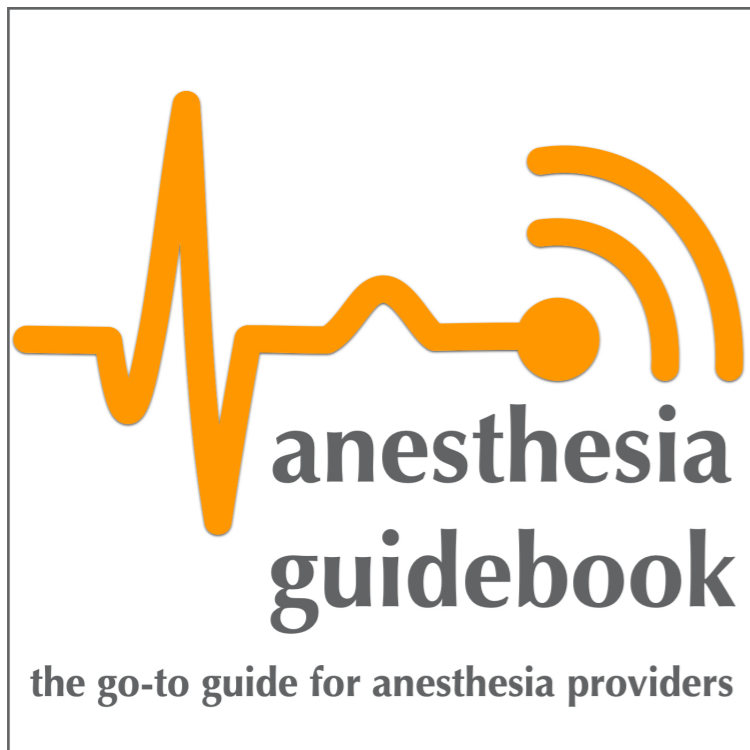

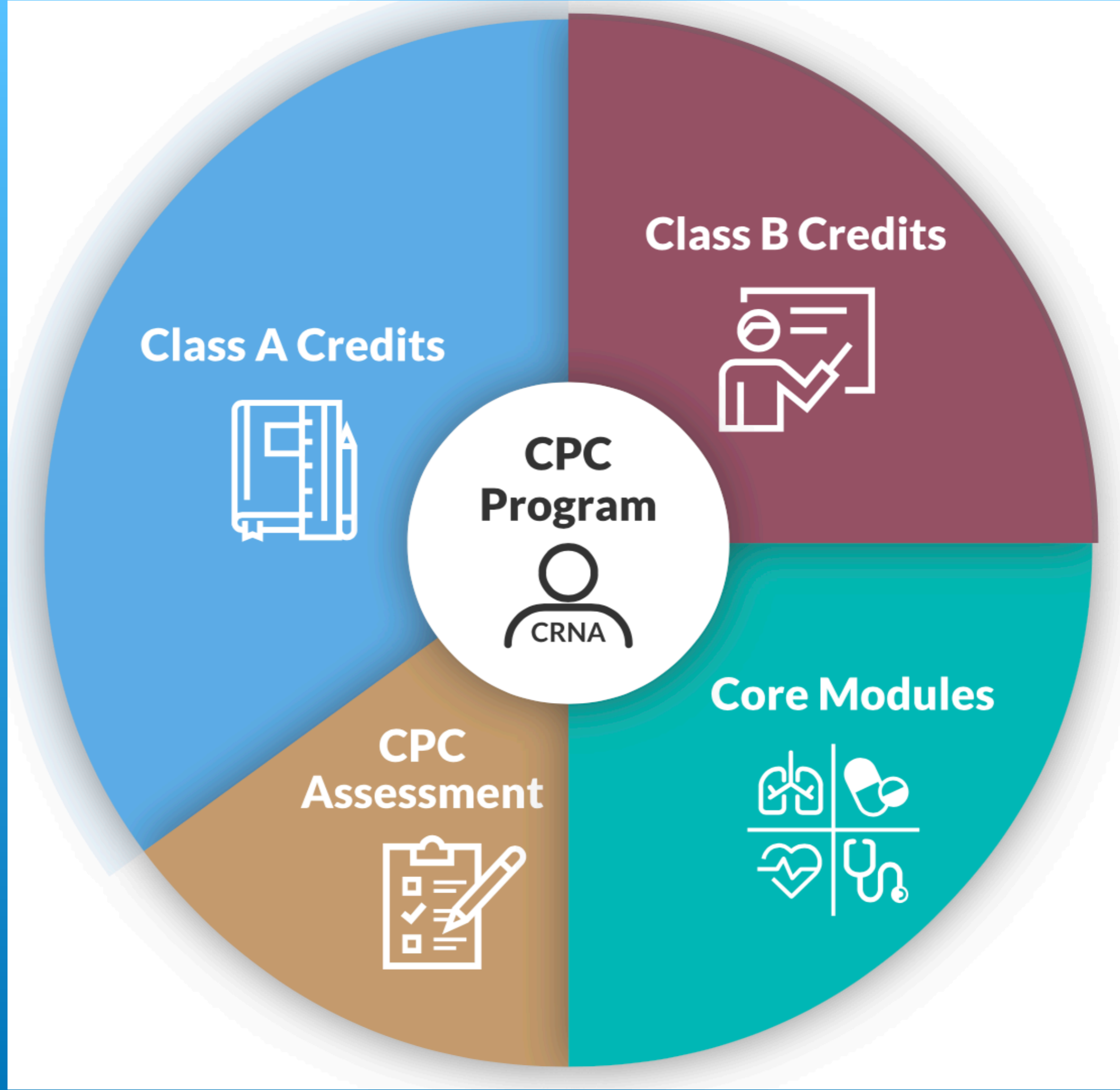

Key Changes

- CPC Assessment (exam) is now MAC Check
- No more Core Modules
- Class A Credits are now MAC Ed
- Class B Credits are now MAC Dev
- Simplified 4-year renewal cycle

Where am I?



- MAC started 8/1/2024.
- If you passed boards after January 2024, you're in MAC.
- If you recertified after January 2024, you're in MAC.
- Still in a 4-year cycle? Finish this CPC cycle, then start MAC.
 - I'm due to recert between 1 March - 31 July 2025, then I'll start MAC.

Class A Credits are now MAC Ed

- **60 Class A credit hours** required *per 4-year cycle*
- Must be **prior approved** by AANA, ANCC, ACCME
- Must include an **assessment**
- Extra Class A credits (>60) count as Class B credits
- **Class A credits are reported for you**

Class B Credits are now MAC Dev

- **40 Class B credit hours** required *per 4-year cycle*
- Professional activities = Class B credit
- ***Do NOT require prior approval or an assessment***
- AANA Members: report credits through AANA Learn
- Non-AANA Members: report credits directly to NBCRNA *if you're audited*

Class B Credit Examples

Non-prior approved/not assessed: 1 hour = 1 credit
(i.e. podcasts, grand rounds, mortality/morbidity conferences)

Academic credits: 1 credit hour = 3 Class B credits

Presentations: 1 hour of presenting = 3 credits

Book publication: 1 book = 10 credits

Chapter publication: 1 chapter = 7 credits

Peer reviewed publication: 1 article = 5 credits

Class B Credit Examples

Precepting (any learner): 1 day = 1 credit

Grant publication: 1 grant = 5 credits

Clinical Admin: 1 year = 5 credits

(i.e. Chief CRNA, Clinical Coordinator, Subspecialty Leader)

Subspecialty/Austere Role: 1 year = 5 credits

(i.e. specialty team, pain management, combat deployment)

Service - seated or elected: 1 year = 5 credits

(i.e. international, national, state, facility boards, committees, task forces)

Service - mission/diplomatic: 1 trip = 5 credits

Class B Credit Examples

Advocacy/Public Relations: 1 day = 5 credits

(i.e. national/state legislative days, career days, etc.)

Research/Practice Inquiry: 1 project = 10 credits

(i.e. principal investigator, DNP/DNAP dissertation, thesis)

Research/Practice Inquiry: 1 project = 5 credits

(i.e. committee/team member)

Life Support Courses: 1 hour = 1 credit

(Up to 20 credits per cycle - may classify as Class A if prior approved.)

Quality Improvement Initiatives: 1 project = 5 credits

(i.e. committee/team involvement)

Class B Credit Examples

Discovery: 1 product = 10 credits

(i.e. creation of tangible product related to anesthesia/health care)

Integration of new clinical technique: 1 skill = 3 credits

(i.e. ultrasound, new blocks, OFA, etc.)

Any Class A credits (>60) count as Class B credits

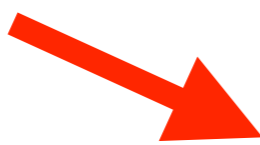

The National Board of Certification and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists (NBCRNA) manages the certification of CRNAs/nurse anesthesiologists. All courses must meet NBCRNA requirements to count toward a CRNA's/nurse anesthesiologist's certification. This includes 100 credits of continuing education and professional development every 4-year cycle. At least 60 must be Class A credits and the remaining Class B.

AANA Members can [report Class B credits](#).

Class B credits do not require prior approval or an assessment. Qualifying activities must do at least one of the following:

- Enhances knowledge of anesthesia practice
- Supports patient safety
- or Fosters an understanding of the broader healthcare environment

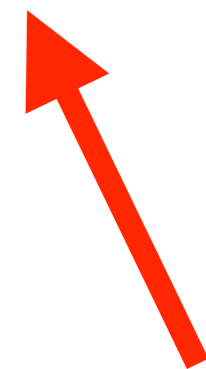

CPC Assessment



- 150-question, 3-hour computerized, closed-book test
- Required once
- Covers four domains:
 1. Airway Management (**34%**)
 2. Applied Clinical Pharmacology (**24%**)
 3. Human Physiology and Pathophysiology (**24%**)
 4. Anesthesia Equipment and Technology (**18%**)
- Cost: \$295

CPC Assessment



- **Not PASS/FAIL**
- **Does NOT affect your credential**
- If you're deficient in a domain, you must take **1 additional Class A credit** pertaining to that domain as remediation *before the end of your CPC cycle*
- *Should be taken at least 6 months before the end of your CPC cycle*
- May be taken at home or at a Pearson testing center.
- If at taking home, begin logging in at least 30 minutes before your start time.

CPCA to MAC Check: Why?

- Point-in-time test (CPCA) versus longitudinal assessment
- NBCRNA listened to feedback from CRNAs
 - CPCA from PASS/FAIL to ***NOT*** PASS/FAIL
- NBCRNA conducted prospective RCT on assessment (Choudhry et al., 2024).
 - One-time test to on-the-go testing
- Assessment required by accreditors to have a credential (CRNA)

MAC Check: How?

- Longitudinal assessment
- App based platform
- 25 multiple choice questions in first quarter
- Immediate feedback + rationales
- Missed questions (up to 5) presented in subsequent quarters (25-30 questions in each subsequent quarter)
- Must participate in 13/16 quarters every 4 years
- Failure to meet performance standard in a domain will result in an additional 5 Class A credits

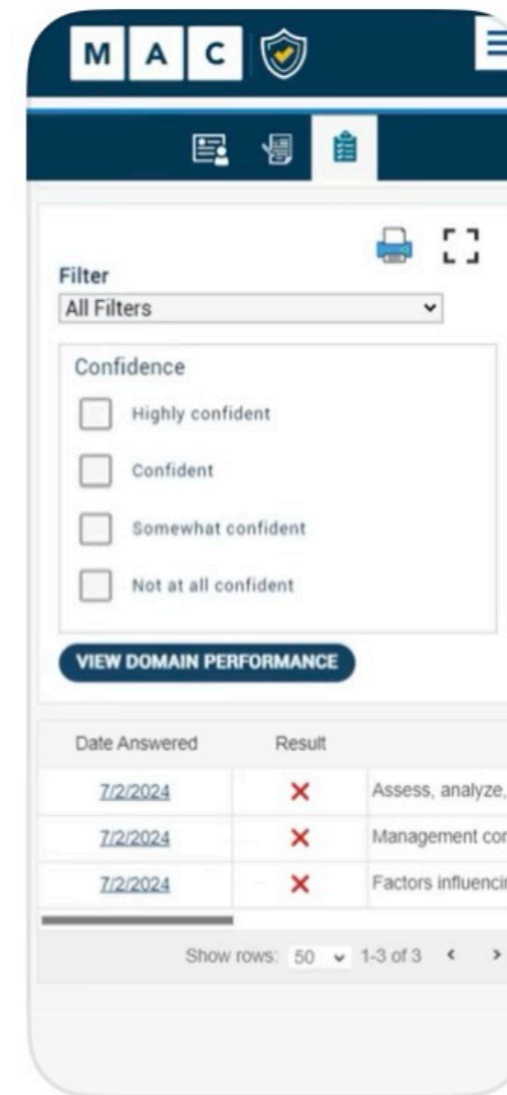
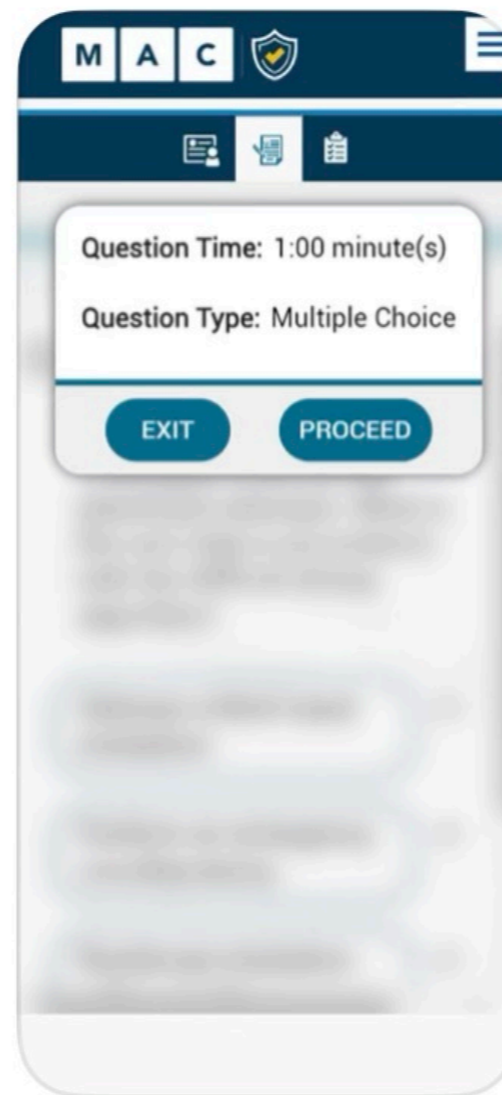
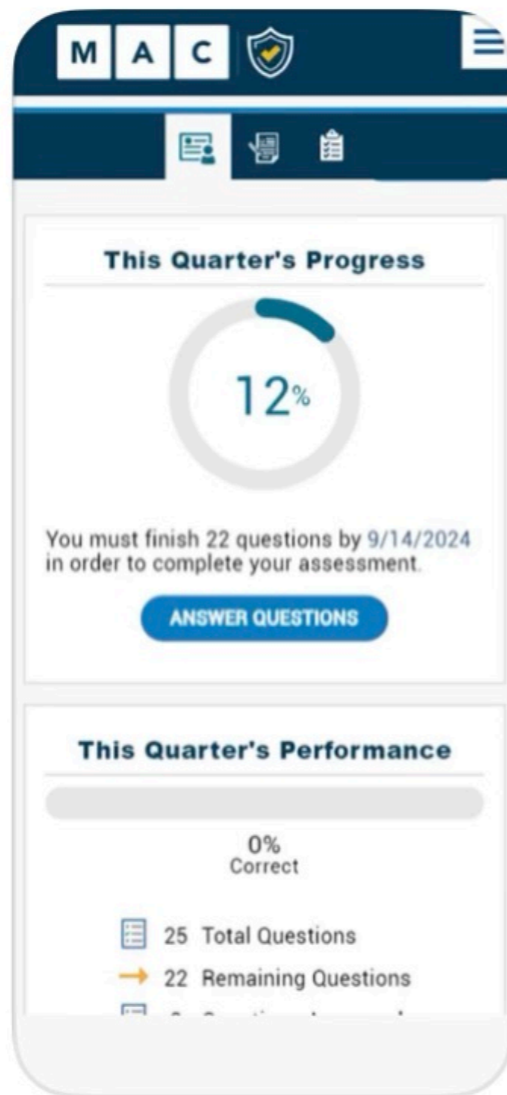

How to master the CPC/MAC Programs

1. Log in to AANA to see where you're at
2. Do these 3 things early:
 1. Report your Class B credit
 2. CPC Assessment: take at least 6-months before the deadline
 3. MAC Check: download the app!
3. Be open minded about the process: master your craft!

NBCRNA is required by their accreditors to have a program to assess CRNA continued competency.

Tips for crushing CPCA/MAC Check

1. Take the CPCA early/MAC Check on-time
2. Don't sweat your score: it's not PASS/FAIL and doesn't directly effect your credential.
3. Relax. They're Celebrations of Knowledge!

Tips for crushing the CPCA

4. Decide to take it in-person or at-home

- In person:
 - Choose date/time/location carefully
 - Plan to drive by and walk in ahead of time
- At home:
 - Schedule it and **READ ALL DIRECTIONS CAREFULLY**
 - Check WiFi, computer specs and block out space/time
 - **Sign in at least 30 minutes early...** it takes this long to set up your computer

Tips for crushing CPCA/MAC Check

5. NBCRNA Provides Practice Questions:

- CPCA: 160 questions
- MAC Check: 20 questions + format experience
